## **APRIL 14TH IS INTERNATIONAL DAY OF PINK!**

April 14th is Day of Pink. Day of Pink has been recognized internationally for over a decade, seeking to eradicate all forms of homophobic and transphobic bullying.

The initiative first began in Nova Scotia in 2007 to combat homophobic and transphobic bullying in school. Two students encouraged their school to wear pink shirts after they witnessed a student being bullied for wearing a pink shirt. After this, it was recognized by other organizations and schools across Canada; for the next decade following, students have been wearing a pink shirt on every third Wednesday of April.

Anti-2SLGBTQ+ bullying has a serious negative impact on the well-being of queer and trans youth and our society more broadly. CCGSD aims to provide 2SLGBTQ+ inclusive programming that ensures that everyone feels respected and affirmed by their communities.

### QUEERING THE CURRICULUM AT WESTERN UNIVERSITY

Our Education Coordinator, Eliot Newton, presented a webinar at Western University's Teacher Candidate Conference Week in February. They'd like to take some time to reflect on the experience. Here's what they had to say!

"I was really grateful to speak at Western University's Teacher Candidate Conference Week in February. This is a topic the CCGSD has presented on before

but it's always one of the things I am most passionate about--queering curriculum outside of health class!

There's a common misconception that our queerness only comes out to play in discussions around sexuality, but I believe queerness is part of our journey as humans, and we should respect and celebrate its presence in all aspects of our lives.

We know that teaching diversity has a "window and mirror" effect--it's important to **reflect** (mirror) diversity for people who don't often see themselves, and important to provide a **window** to people who don't encounter or think about diversity in their daily lives. In this lecture, I talk about a "stoplight" method of teaching diversity in situations where you may have different amounts of latitude to discuss queer people and their contributions to the world.

We initially demoed this lecture at an American conference, where some school boards can be particularly restrictive--but Canada is not immune! I was grateful for 'candid' conversations with these teacher candidates (see what I did there) and look forward to continuing this conversation in future learning opportunities."
